When game ideas have been sent to me, I will be sending them out to other class teachers in school to share with their students to play!

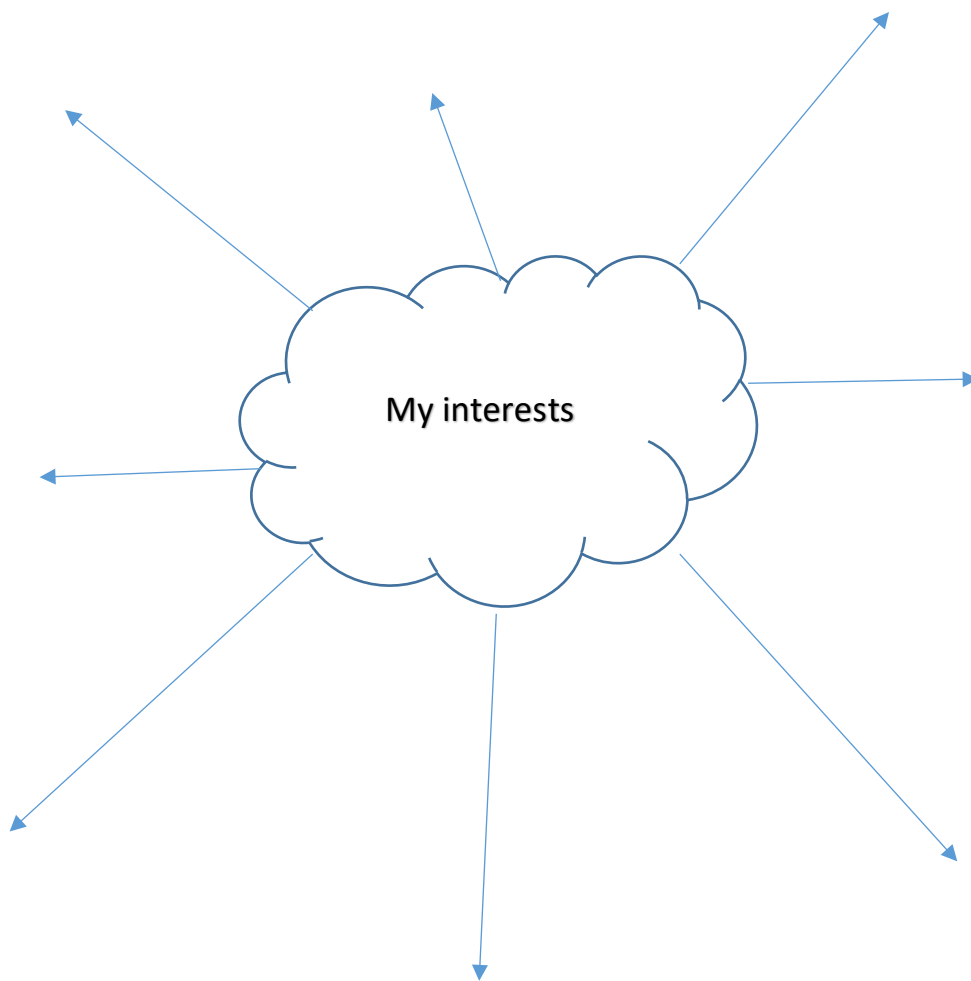
## Task 1

Complete the thought shower below of all things you are interested in (this could be absolutely anything....for example trains, number, sports...be as specific as you can)

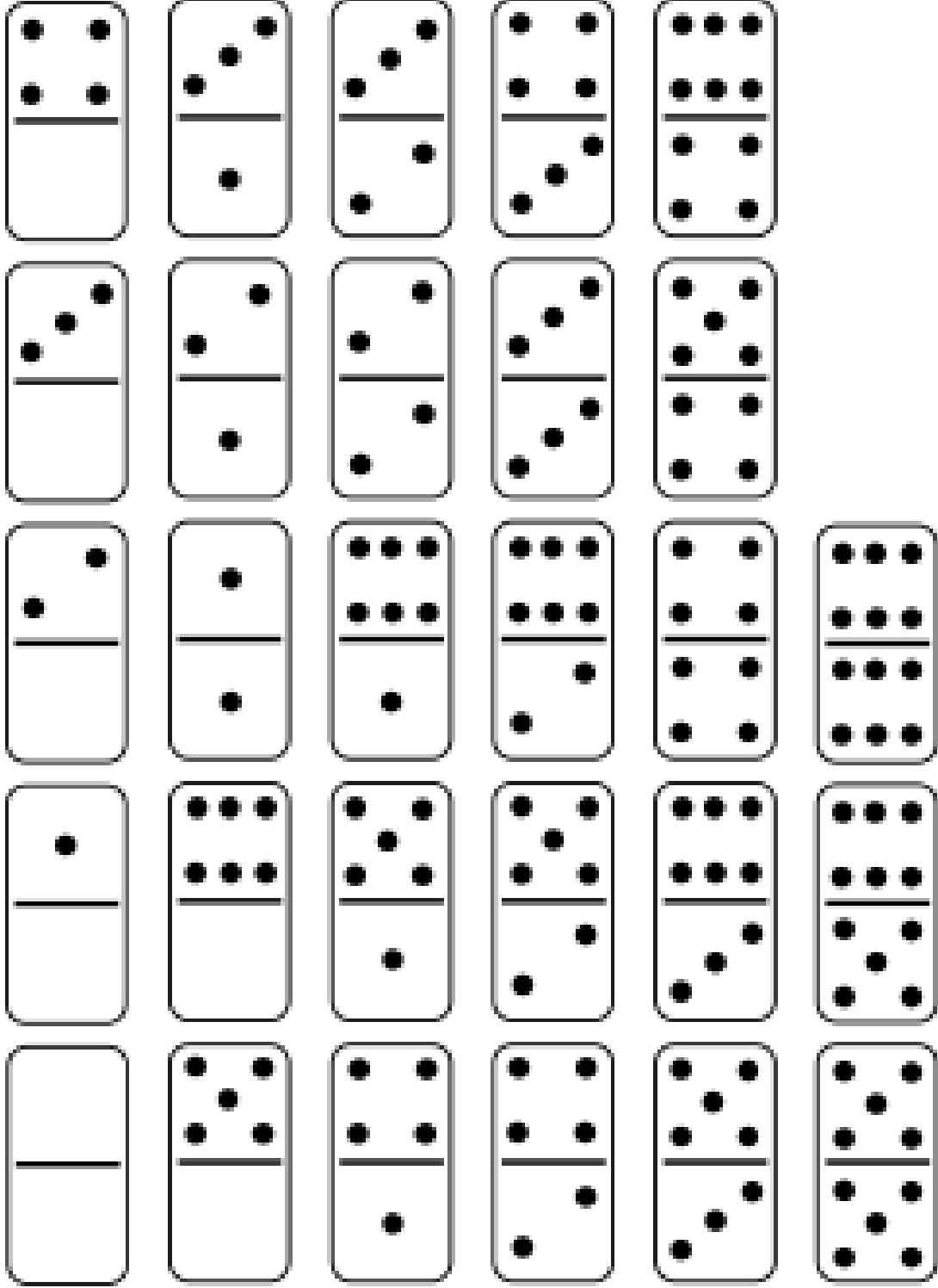


### Task 3

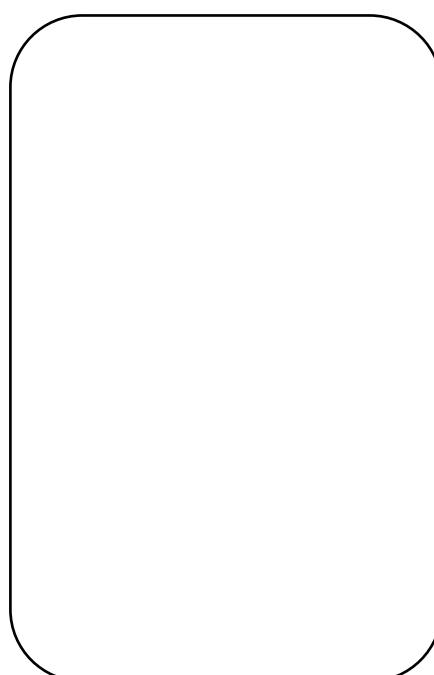
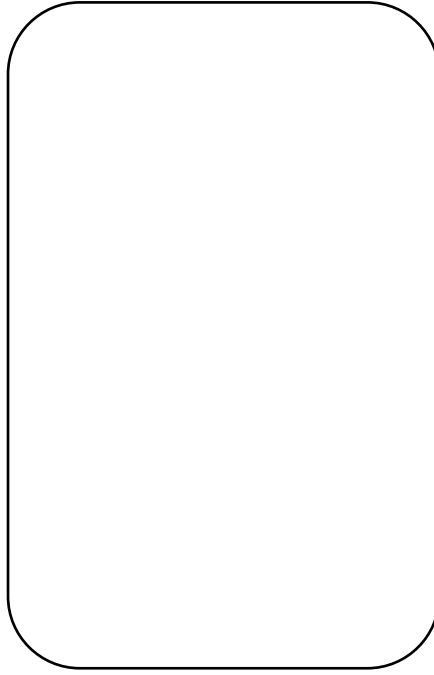
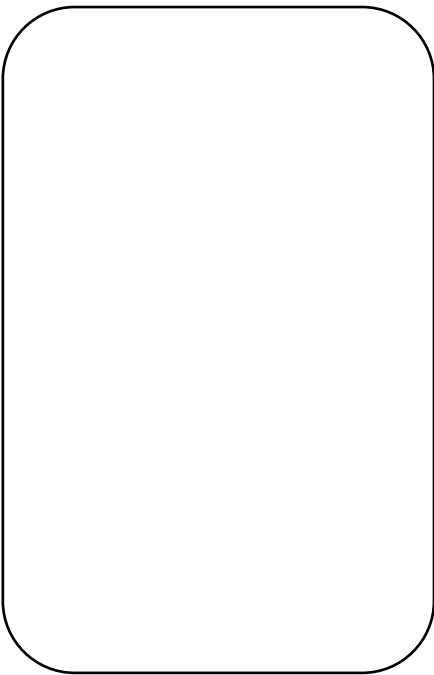
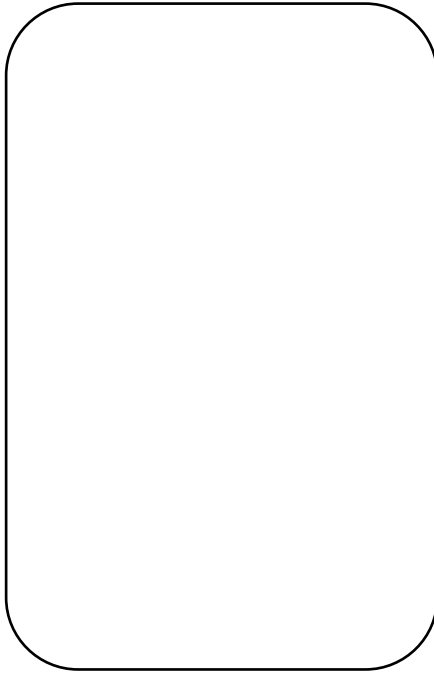
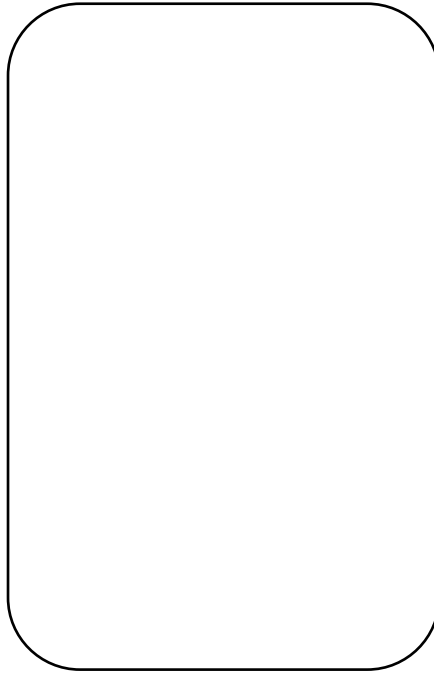
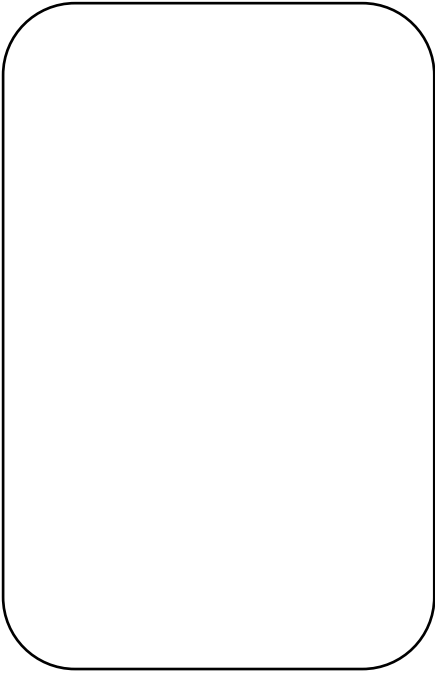
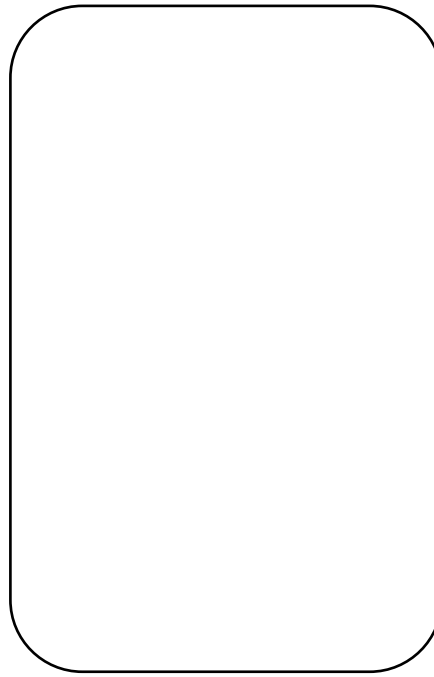
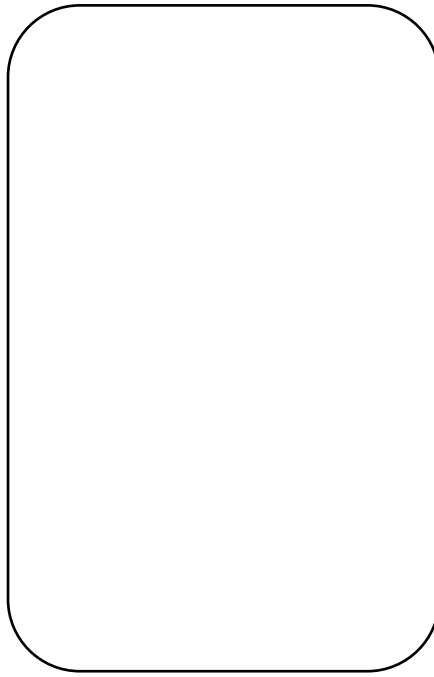
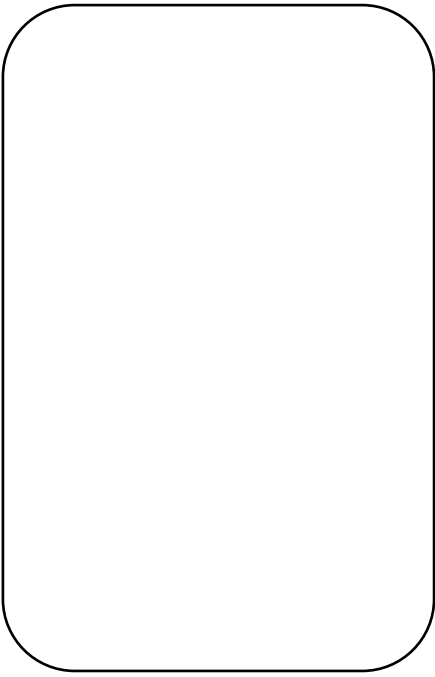
**Task 5:**

For example:



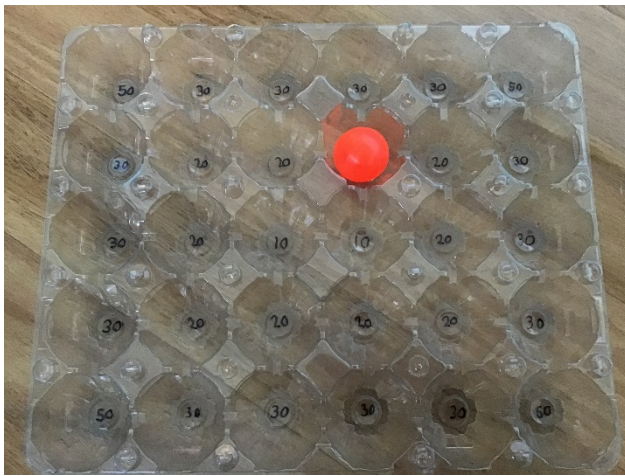
I used a clear egg box and wrote scores underneath the box.
